Topics of Raised by Participants

- Communication strategy with CMOs which are getting bigger (elephant vs ants) - resources needed for managing outsourced operations
- (tech transfer and other milestones)
- Supporting external assets
- Challenges and opportunities alliance and sharing
- How to manage CMOs in the US



Topics of Raised by Participants

- Outsourcing development other people slotting into our model – communications (we know what we are doing – time allocation)
- Initiation do it right first time (too much time upfront)
- Regulatory perspective of inspection and oversight of CMOs
- Change control / case studies / whitepapers
- Strategy for documenting risk develop a risk assessment tool
- Capabilities understand them and listen



Topics of Raised by Participants

- Testing / transfer of assays getting it right
- Expectations big pharma vs little CMO
- Proactive hear the voice of the customer preventing the bad things from happening
- Do the big CMO's have a screening process for which clients they will accept?
- Do pharma co's have a screening process for which contractors they will work with?



Quality Culture

- TRUST transparency
- Single point of contact project manager is it a professional (quality) or is it business or what...
- Role of the QP influence on quality requirements – US vs EU – differing quality standards? Different requirements
- Highly potent biologic ants to elephants our quality standards or theirs



Relationship management

- Quality Agreements ours or theirs?
- Quality System
- Who's responsible for supply chain and due diligence on that??
- Regulatory inspections
- CFO says "outsource it's cost effective" but is it and what resources are really needed for appropriate oversight and risk management
- subcontracting



Prevention is about managing risk

- Risk management should allow us to identify and triage the high risk outsourced operations and then to manage those risks
- Identifying risks and the associated control mechanisms should allow us to assign appropriate resources
- If we can introduce a cost of quality / non quality to that model we will have a stronger case for getting resources from management



The initial risk assessment should be by the contract giver

- Risk Factors:
 - Compliance bad regulatory inspection (potential exposure in terms of: shutdown / recall or other regulatory action)
 - High deviation rate / transparency
 - Technical competencies do they have the skills set and the facilities to run the project do they know what they are doing what will be the total cost (overall)
 - Anti quality culture indicators:
 - Lack of change control
 - Place of quality dept in the organization who's reporting to whom
 - Documentation practices time to receive completed batch record
 - Exceedingly low deviation reporting
 - Personnel competency



Communication and key contact

- Have a professional project manager and a quality person and a logistics person and CMC and supply chain and...????
- Have professional who is an SME? Subject matter expert?
- PROJECT MANAGER where are they in the organization and what AUTHORITY do they have in their job description



Risk assessment tool

 We assign risk to the project based on a formal risk assessment and then we design controls and assign resources for project management



Utilizing outsourced resources in the most efficient manner

- Cooperation
- Contract giver needs to accept the quality system at the service provider – if you don't do that after auditing it – you can't give the contract



Compromise? Back Up? RISK MITIGATION

- PIP person in plant
- Business contract conflicts with Quality
 Agreement internal conflict in my
 organization before I take it outside to the
 contractor
- Do you have an OUTSOURCING POLICY? Sort of? – Managing CMOs



Outsourced Operations Policy (for the Contract Giver / Owner of NDA)

- Risk management
- Legal obligations (especially batch release)
- PIP authority for that person SME vs quality vs engineers (decision making / signature authority)
- Resource assignment and management
- Decision making process (process flow) and authority for that / consequences
- Other...
