



# Confidentiality, Conflicts, and Copyright Agreement for Volunteers of PDA

This Agreement is made between \_\_\_\_\_ (“you”) and Parenteral Drug Association, Inc. (“PDA”), based on mutual consideration, the receipt and adequacy of which are acknowledged.

PDA thanks you for agreeing to support PDA’s nonprofit and tax-exempt purposes by serving as a volunteer for PDA activities (e.g., task force technical documents teams, standards, regulatory commenting efforts, etc.). Your participation as a volunteer of PDA is very important. Therefore, you agree as follows:

1. You will not disclose or cause to be disclosed to anyone outside of PDA, its Board, committees, staff, or other volunteers, any confidential information related to PDA, unless otherwise directed by PDA. This restriction shall always apply and in any circumstance during your volunteer work with PDA and for a period of two (2) years after your volunteer work with PDA has concluded.
2. Ownership of any materials you prepare or develop for PDA in your volunteer capacity while serving on the PDA Committee shall be retained by and automatically assigned to PDA upon creation. If any materials you prepare or develop for PDA contain copyrighted material owned by third parties, including your employer, you must notify PDA so that PDA can obtain written permission from the copyright owner so that such copyrighted material can be used by PDA.
3. You will not engage in actions, discussions, or voting which may constitute an actual, apparent, or potential conflict of interest with your participation as a volunteer of PDA. You will disclose to PDA any such conflicts of interest and any business, financial, or organizational interests and affiliations which are or could be construed to be a conflict of interest.
4. You grant to PDA the right to use your name and biographical information in connection with your service on the PDA Committee. You will not receive any royalties or other compensation for your service on the PDA Committee.
